SPC1 TO NOMINATE AND ELECT A CHAIR

Mr Flood told the meeting that Mr Squires wised to talk before the appointment of Chairman and that he, Mr Flood had decided to resign. Mr Squires said due to one member of the Council who had undermined the Chairman, that Council members were not prepared to stay on the Council if that Councillor was staying, Mr Flood was standing down and leaving the meeting. Mr Piper said he had tendered his resignation that morning and was also leaving the Council. Mr Squires was resigning in support of Mr Flood and Mr Hazel also got up to walk out. Before leaving Mr Flood felt the need to point his finger and shout at one of the two remaining Councillors making numerous accusations in front of eight members of the public. That he had put members of the public in danger, that he had ridiculed the LCN emergency planning procedure when the Councillor had previously represented Sparkford on that Committee, complained that he shouldn't be a Councillor as he didn't live in the village (although he is within a 3 mile radius of the village). He told the Councillor in question he had broken the code of conduct and was not in a position to hold an office in the Council.

As the Council was not quorate the Council meeting could not go ahead. Cllr Hobhouse informed the clerk that Democratic Services needed advising first thing in the morning. That on Mr Quick's return if he still wished to stay on the Council then they would be able to hold a meeting with all three remaining Councillors present.

No decisions could be made tonight.

The meeting closed at 8.30pm.
